Registered Apprenticeship Consultants

- Frontline Representatives of The Division Registered Apprenticeship
- Coordinate Registration of the Employer/Sponsor program
- Manage and Guide Employers and Apprentices through the registration process
- Work with Employers and Career and Technical Administrator/WBL Point of Contact

Registered Apprenticeship is an On-the-Job structured employment training program that has <u>6</u> components:

- Employer involvement
- On-the-job training
- Related Technical Instruction
- Paid work experience
- Award of a nationally recognized industry credential
- Registered with the Division of Registered Apprenticeship

Registered Apprenticeship (RA)

- A Program for anyone 16+ (with some exceptions for hazardous occupations)
- May work full or part-time
- Participate in Occupation Specific Related Technical Instruction
- Must satisfy a minimum of 2000 OJT Hours and 144 RTI Hours per year. Terms of apprenticeship vary from 1-6 years

Youth Registered Apprenticeship (YRA) Programs

In a YRA program, students begin an apprenticeship during high school, meaning they are employed by a business as an apprentice while still a student.

Youth Registered App<mark>renticeship</mark> (YRA)

- A Program for High School Students 16+ enrolled in a Career and Technical Education (CTE) program.(with some exceptions for hazardous occupations)
- Related Technical Instruction comes from the CTE curriculum.
- YRA may be part-time or full-time at various times of the year.
- Registered with The Division of Registered Apprenticeship
- Upon High School Graduation receives a Certificate of Participation

FACTS

HIGH SCHOOL = EMPLOYER/SPONSOR STUDENT = EMPLOYEE/APPRENTICE **ON-THE-JOB TRAINING = EMPLOYMENT** RELATED TECHNICAL INSTRUCTION = CTE APPRENTICEABLE OCCUPATIONS = 1000+ COMMUNITY FOOTPRINT
